Twenty-two mission maniacs are headed to Uganda from the U.S. and U.K. for our second annual mission trip. Result: The world is about to change for hundreds of people in the Bundibugyo District!

Imagine five doctors, eleven medical students, a nurse, and a physical therapist working hand-in-glove with our professional Ugandan care team. Stir into the mix five more people who aren't medically trained but will assist in a variety of ways. Listen to physicians and students teaching core classes on the topics of hygiene, nutrition and clean water, and sex education/HIV prevention. Feel the excitement as waves of people line up to receive triage and then treatment. Watch 75 formerly-blind people walk away from eye surgery that restores their sight. How much more exciting can this get?

Our suitcases are bulging. Every mission tripper gets one checked bag for his/her personal items, but the other bag is for the mission. We will take hundreds of hygiene kits and birthing kits, lots of medicine, toothbrushes, and soccer balls. We'll have 60 more solar-powered audio Bibles (in their local dialect), shoes, and some small gifts for the kids. A big chunk



of the load is 367 pounds of equipment and supplies for the eye surgeons who will help people see. Yes, 367 pounds!

You have to be there to experience the joy and appreciation from a child who wears his first pair of shoes, a pregnant mom who receives a birthing kit, or a girl who can go to school every day because she has a hygiene kit. Feeling their emotion changes your life as much as it changes theirs.





Even if you have to stay home while we have all the fun in Uganda, you can participate. You can be part of the action.
