- The Rwenzori Times, a news magazine that covers 13 districts in western Uganda, printed a glowing, two-page report on Ourganda's 'Every Child Is Safe' campaign.
- A long list of high-ranking government officials attended the event and **demonstrated their full support**.

 Every person who agreed to join the army of volunteers to protect children received a wristband with the phone number to call if a child is in danger or has been violated. Joinus Kyarisiima, Ourganda's Children's Champion, flooded
Ourganda's campus and our villages with 1,200 wrist bands.



On September 5, this was clear: If you are a child, you feel safer than ever. If you are willing to protect children, you have joined a massive and motivated army. If you are an offender, you either stop the abuse or you will be incarcerated in Bubukwanga's notorious prison.

As our team was still on the flight from Uganda to Seattle, Joinus sent us this message: "I take the pleasure to thank almighty God who is enabling us to do our work in the children ministry... According to the statistics from the police, in areas where Ourganda operates, the police rarely receive cases of domestic violence and sexual violence. This has been achieved due to the ecosystem where soul sisters, mankind and opinion leaders work hand in hand with Ourganda... We are indeed igniting hope where children, women and men are safe, happy and healthy."
